## **ADVANCED WORKSHOP 15 ASSIGNMENT**

- 1. Read the section about documentation panels on p. 115 in the teacher's guide. Review the curriculum and look for places where the directions ask you to make a documentation panel.
- 2. Identify an aspect of your children's exploration that you would like to document.
- 3. Collect a set of three or four documents that you can use to create a panel that reflects your children's engagement in science inquiry. Use the following guidelines when collecting:
  - Documents should all be related to a particular aspect of your exploration. For example, they might be about strategies for moving water or an investigation of drops.
  - The documents should be varied, including some or all of the following: children's drawings or paintings, photos of three-dimensional representations, photos of children engaged in the exploration, quotes from their conversation, predictions, and conclusions.
